Description: As users of the SATPAC Program, there are many components and subtleties to enhance your use of the program. These will be covered in detail. There will be a review of the 7 most difficult sounds to remediate using the SATPAC Approach and examining subtle problems that may be keeping your students from achieving success with their Speech Sound Disorders (SSDs).

The SATPAC Approach incorporates conversation-like activities into the earliest phases of therapy (normal rate, natural prosody and coarticulation) along with other best practices (facilitating contexts, the use of nonwords and many repetitions) to quickly, efficiently and systematically remediate speech sound disorders.

Case studies will be examined in detail and you will work in small groups to develop remediation programs using the SATPAC Approach for the various students presented to remediate their SSDs.

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
